KRRR is pleased to announce that Megan Kiley and Blair Morgan are the winners of the 2011 KRRR Bursaries.

Megan Kiley is a graduate of Loyalist Collegiate. A multi-sport athlete, Megan was a member of her school's Cross Country team, becoming a more serious runner over the past couple of years. She has competed in KRRR Road Races and the KTown Short Course Triathlon. She is a dedicated volunteer, both at her school and in the community, having served as a Student Trustee on The Limestone District School Board, in leadership roles on various councils, teams, and other school initiatives. She has given her time to volunteer with Alzheimer's Society, MS Walk, Boys and Girls Club, the Dragon Boat Festival, as well as The United Way. She won The 2010 National Case Study Competition on Green Tourism, and will be attending Brock University in September, 2011 in Physical Education/Concurrent Education. Whether on the road, on the soccer pitch, on the court, in the classroom or at the Board Office, her dedication, perseverance, commitment and a willingness to ready for anything allows her to strive for excellence and to encourage others to do the same.

Blair Morgan is a graduate of Ernestown Secondary school. He entered his first road race in 1996 and his first triathlon at the age of eight.
